SAURO CAVALLINI



Sauro Cavallini (La Spezia, 1927 – Fiesole, 2016) was a renowned Italian sculptor celebrated for his expressive bronze and metal works blending realism with lyrical abstraction. Largely self-taught, he began his artistic career in Florence in the 1950s and established his studio in Fiesole, where he lived and worked for the rest of his life.

Cavallini rose to prominence after restoring sculptures damaged in the 1966 Arno flood, developing a signature style marked by fluid lines and humanist themes such as peace and fraternity. His monumental Hymn to Life (1990), gifted by Italy to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg, remains one of his most iconic works. His sculptures are displayed in Monaco, Bonn, Genoa, and Florence, among others, and his legacy is preserved through the Sauro Cavallini Study Centre in Fiesole, ensuring his vision continues to inspire.

LAURENCE JENKELL



Laurence Jenkell, known as JENK, is a French painter and sculptor based in Vallauris on the Côte d'Azur. Since the 1990s, she has gained international recognition for her iconic "Wrapping Candy" sculptures—vibrant, twisted forms created from plexiglass, bronze, marble, aluminum, and Murano glass. Rooted in a childhood fascination with sweets, her work transforms personal memories into universal symbols, exploring themes of nostalgia, identity, and emotional expression. JENK has since expanded her practice with series such as DNA helices, robots, and butterflies, merging personal narrative with reflections on science and society. Her works are part of collections in over 25 countries and have been showcased in major exhibitions including the 2011 G20 Summit in Cannes, the Oculus in New York (2018), and the A8 motorway installation in Nice (2023).



UMBERTO CICERI



Born in Legnano (Milan), **Umberto Ciceri** is an Italian artist currently living between Barcelona and Bologna. A graduate of the Milan Academy of Arts & Design, his early career in fashion fueled his interest in optics, color chemistry, and neurophysiological perception, leading to the creation of his signature technique, Hypertrait. This method, based on neuroaesthetics, uses special lenses and interference patterns to engage viewers in a dynamic, kinetic experience with his artwork. Ciceri's work has been exhibited in renowned venues, including the Maga Museum (18th Giornata del Contemporaneo), Kunstverein Friedberg (Identities, 2020), Museo Marino Marini (Ex Voto, 2019), Teatros del Canal (Madrid, 2017), and the Venice Biennale (2011). He has also shown at Artefiera, Art Miami, Scope, MIArt, and Fotografia Europea. In 2018, Ciceri presented Human Fights Right Lights at the Reggia di Caserta under the patronage of Amnesty International.









HUSSAIN JAMIL



Hussain Jamil is a Dubai-based visual artist whose work spans sculpture, public art, and immersive installations. Originally trained in miniature painting, he now works with stainless steel, wire mesh, and mirrored surfaces to explore reflection, illusion, and form.

His series Threads of Reflections reimagines the traditional craft of Haseer weaving using contemporary materials. Jamil has exhibited at the Pakistan National Council of the Arts and Dubai Design Week, and created large-scale installations for the Burj Al Arab, One Za'abeel, and Dubai Hills.

He is the recipient of the Engro Juried Art Prize and was named Artist of the Year 2022. His works are featured in major collections including the HH Collection.





YANA RUSNAK



Yana Rusnak is a contemporary Ukrainian artist whose works are featured in private collections across cities such as Miami, New York, Dubai, Riyadh, London, Geneva, and Kyiv. Her practice merges figurative and abstract forms, creating compositions that evoke spiritual and emotional depth.

Rejecting traditional brushwork for much of her process, Rusnak uses custom techniques to shape the backgrounds, reserving brushes only for the gold and silver figures that define her work. Her art explores a "dialogue with the universe," drawing on music, light, nature, and the cosmos to channel energy, passion, and inner spirit. A signature element in Rusnak's paintings is her use of gold, symbolizing ancient wisdom, divine connection, and the mystery of existence. Generously poured into her canvases, gold becomes a metaphor for light, love, and sacred creative power.



MR. BRAINWASH



Thierry Guetta, known as **Mr. Brainwash**, is a French-born, Los Angeles-based artist who blends street art and pop art into a bold, recognizable visual language. He gained global attention through his appearance in Banksy's documentary Exit Through the Gift Shop, which earned an Academy Award nomination and brought his work to the forefront of the contemporary art scene.

Known for large-scale exhibitions and collaborations, Mr. Brainwash has worked with brands like Hublot, Coca-Cola, and Marvel. He has designed album covers for Madonna, Rick Ross, and KYGO, and his art has appeared in Billions, The Kardashians, and Molly's Game.

Beyond his artistic practice, he supports causes through donations and public murals, including tributes to 9/11. His vibrant, optimistic imagery continues to attract collectors and fans across art, music, and pop culture.

LUDMILA RADCHENKO



Ludmilla Radchenko is an internationally recognized Pop artist based in Milan, known for her bold, ironic works that explore the paradoxes of consumerism and pop culture. With a background in fashion and training at the New York Film Academy, she developed a dynamic technique blending decoupage, acrylic, stucco, and resin into layered, hand-painted compositions.


Radchenko has exhibited at Scope Art Basel, the Venice Biennale, and MAC Museum Milan, with works held in notable collections including those of Sebastian Vettel and the Elio Fiorucci Foundation. A pioneer in digital innovation, she was among the first to sell art via Bitcoin and has certified over 600 works on the blockchain. Her recent series—Icons Recycling, The Wings of Power, and Brand Revolution—affirm her status as a fearless voice in contemporary art.


LOLA SERGOUNINE



Lola Sergounine is a Georgian-born multidisciplinary artist whose creative path bridges Eastern heritage and global artistic influence. Born in Tbilisi in 1987, she studied Art Law at the University of Georgia and later refined her technique through private classes with Kazakh artist Bakhyt Bapishev in Paris and Tokyo, shaping her unique visual voice. Lola's work resists linear interpretation. With a philosophy that "the artist creates, and the viewer interprets," her art invites introspection, emotional honesty, and aesthetic freedom. Her practice blends structure with spontaneity, offering layered works that reflect both personal and cultural chaos. She has exhibited in major cities such as London, Venice, Rome, and Tbilisi, and her work is part of private collections across Europe and the Middle East. Lola was also featured in Artleove Magazine (Issue 01/23) with the interview In Control of the Chaos: A Sit-Down with Lolita Papava, highlighting her rising international presence.




Lola Sergounine Trusting You, 2025 Mixed media art with oil pastel on canvas 180x120

SEATY



French artist Seaty, born in 1983, is a leading voice in contemporary urban art.

Influenced by 1990s hip-hop and graffiti culture, he began creating street art at an early age. Self-taught, he dedicated himself to art in 2012, choosing the name "Seaty" as a tribute to the city—his first canvas.

His portraits feature powerful faces from various ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Using black and white as a base, he adds bold strokes of color to create striking visual contrasts. His style merges realism and abstraction, evoking both emotion and intensity. Seaty works across unconventional media, including road signs, cars, mailboxes, and phone booths. Though discreet in persona, he embraces collaboration and large-scale public art. Highlights include a hand-painted Mini Clubman in Monaco, an iconic phone booth in Courchevel, murals in Kingston and Cannes, and a monumental work in Dreux. Known for his instantly recognizable aesthetic, Seaty continues to captivate audiences with works that bridge street culture and fine art.


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
