Preface

The encounter between Silvio Porzionato and Laurence Jenkell in Sweet Faces brings together two artistic languages that, at first sight, appear remote yet ultimately converge in their exploration of memory, identity, and desire. On the one hand, Porzionato's monumental portraits expand the human face to a scale that transcends individuality, transforming anonymous sitters into archetypal presences that speak to the universal within the personal. On the other, Jenkell's sculptural candies, executed in resin, metal, or marble, reimagine a childhood object of longing as a contemporary symbol of play, seduction, and cultural consumption.

Porzionato's practice situates the human visage within a space of contemplation. His paintings are at once intimate and monumental: the close-up renders each wrinkle, glance, or fleeting expression with photographic precision, yet the sheer scale abstracts the sitter into a timeless icon.

Jenkell, by contrast, operates in the language of Pop-inflected sculpture. Her Wrapping Candy works recall not only the sweetness of childhood but also the structures of DNA, the elegance of spirals, and the architectural forms of wrapping and twisting. What once represented a private deprivation is elevated into a universal metaphor. In her hands, the candy becomes both delightful object and cultural signifier, evoking questions about temptation, indulgence, and the aestheticization of consumption.

The juxtaposition of portraits and candies creates a dialogue that is more than visual contrast. It is an encounter between introspection and whimsy, solemnity and delight. What endures most in cultural consciousness — the penetrating gaze of another, or the irresistible allure of what is forbidden? In posing this question, Sweet Faces reveals how everyday imagery — a face, a piece of candy — carries layers of meaning that reach far beyond their surfaces, transforming into icons of our time.



SILVIO PORZIONATO

Silvio Porzionato (b. 1971, Moncalieri, Italy) is a contemporary figurative painter known for monumental oil portraits that transform ordinary people into universal icons. After a decade as a designer, he turned to painting and soon earned recognition with the Mondadori Art Prize and inclusion in the 54th Venice Biennale.

In 2013, he created Temporal Code for the Museum of Contemporary Art in Sicily — 112 portraits tracing human life from childhood to old age. His works have since appeared at Art Miami, Kiaf Seoul, London Art Fair, Contemporary Istanbul, and in exhibitions worldwide.

Recent highlights include the 007 Portraits commission for Aston Martin (Milan, 2021) and solo shows in Genoa, Bogotá, and Algarve. Today, Porzionato is celebrated for capturing the timeless essence of human presence.






Red Star - Manga series, 2024

LAURENCE JENKELL

Laurence Jenkell is a French painter and sculptor based in Vallauris on the Côte d'Azur. Since the mid-1990s, she has been renowned for her Wrapping Candy sculptures — colorful works in plexiglass, bronze, marble, aluminum, and Murano glass, created through her unique technique of heating and twisting materials.

Inspired by a childhood fascination with sweets, she transformed this memory into a universal symbol, later expanding into series such as DNA helices, robots, and butterflies.

Her works are in collections worldwide and have featured in major exhibitions including Candy Nations at the 2011 G20 Summit in Cannes, Wrapping Candy at the Oculus, World Trade Center New York (2018), and a monumental installation on the A8 motorway in Nice (2023).




Oblong Contemporary is an Italian gallery established in 2019 in Forte dei Marmi, Tuscany, with a second space in Dubai. Rooted in the Tuscan sculptural tradition, the gallery is dedicated to presenting contemporary art that unites material mastery with conceptual vision.

Its program features celebrated artists such as Gianfranco Meggiato, Stefano Bombardieri, Igor Mitoraj, Sophia Vari, Gustavo Vélez, Laurence Jenkell, and Silvio Porzionato, together with distinctive Italian voices including Giuseppe Maiorana. The gallery curates exhibitions and projects across Forte dei Marmi, Milan, Lucca, and Dubai, underscoring the continuity between Italy's artistic heritage and the evolving language of contemporary practice.

Oblong Contemporary distinguishes itself through a focus on monumental sculpture, painting, and cross-disciplinary projects. Working with artists who explore themes of identity, memory, and transformation, the gallery seeks to create exhibitions that are both visually striking and intellectually engaging.




